FIRST SEMESTER

Course: ASSAPG -1014 The Assamese Language: Background, Origin And Development

- 1) By the end of this course, students will be able to: The origin and development of the Assamese language in the historical perspective in relation to growth and development of Indo-Aryan languages in various stages. Students are expected to be acquainted themselves with the prescribed discourses.

Course: ASSAPG -1024 Trend and Tendencies Of Modern Assamese Literature (Modern Period Up To 2000)
